Malik Yoba

Actor, activist, entrepreneur

Malik Yoba, born in the South Bronx and raised in Harlem, is a Hollywood veteran with more than three decades of commitment to the arts. He has amassed over 50 film credits and more than a dozen lead roles in network/cable TV series.

His debut in the Disney classic “Cool Runnings” and his performances as New York police detective J.C. Williams in the groundbreaking police drama, “New York Undercover,” catapulted Malik into the fabric of American culture.

Malik, alongside Michael DeLorenzo, made TV history in “New York Undercover” as it was the first police drama on American TV to feature two people of color in the starring roles. Malik won three consecutive NAACP Image Awards for Outstanding Actor in a Drama Series for that part.

He went on to star in films such as “Copland,” “The Good Nurse,” “Soul Food,” “Ride,” and Tyler Perry’s “Why Did I Get Married” and “Why Did I Get Married Too.”

His TV credits include “Blue Bloods,” “The Good Wife,” “Law and Order,” “Empire,” “Arrested Development,” “Girlfriends,” “Single Ladies,” “Designated Survivor,” “The Last O.G.” and “God Friended Me.”

Among his branded digital content clients are BET, Gillete, the American Cancer Society, the United Negro College Fund, AARP and Google.

Yet among all of his acting success, Malik considers himself a community and youth activist first. Starting at 16 years old as a tutor and theater instructor at the Upward Fund Afterschool Program in Harlem, Malik went on to work with the Citykids Foundation, where he became the vice president at 23 years old and is vice president emeritus. He has worked with youth globally including helping to build a school in Ethiopia called Ethiopian Children’s Village.

A serial entrepreneur, the emerging real estate developer has projects in NYC and Baltimore, and is currently in post-production for his educational docuseries, “The Real Estate Mixtape, Volume 1: Build NY.” The series follows Malik and a cohort of youth as he navigates his first commercial real estate deal in NYC, which is currently happening in the South Bronx, and includes the building of a new school, sports and wellness center and affordable housing.

He has served as a board member of The Center for Social Innovation; The Boston Arts Academy Foundation; and The One Brooklyn Fund. Most recently, he was invited to become the honorary chair of the School of Construction at Pratt University.

Malik lives by the creed, “Build your own generator so when they turn off the power, you still have lights.”

Dr. Takis Etim Caiafas

Lagos and Cross River Conference, A.M.E. Zion Church

The Rev. Dr. Takis Etim Caiafas was received into the ministry of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church in 1996 as a traveling minister and was later ordained as a deacon and elder.

He was appointed as presiding elder of the Lagos and Cross River Conference in Nigeria, West Africa, from 2002-2018; and served as president presiding elder of the Eastern West Africa Episcopal District, Apapa, Lagos/Calabar, simultaneously through 2019.

To date, he serves as Bishop Administrative Assistant for the Lagos/Cross River Conference; is a board member of the Hood Speaks Theological Seminary in Ndon, Ebom, where he serves as vice chairman of finance; and is chairman of the Christian Council of Nigeria, Cross River State.

Dr. Caiafas' educational background is extensive, having attended Tottenham Technical College in London in 1973; the University of Herriot Watt University in Edinburgh in 1979; the University of Lagos, Nigeria, in 1999; the United Ministerial College of Theology & Seminary in 2005; and the Monkfield Theological College of the United Kingdom in 2006. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Organization; an LLB degree (Bachelor of Laws); a Master of Arts degree in religious studies; and a trained missionary diploma.

His working career in the banking industry began in Port Harcourt, Nigeria, in 1982, when he worked as a relief manager in the advances/review control department. He went on to serve as a branch relief manager/audit officer; bills and credit manager; inspector and assistant chief inspector; AG general manager; head/chief compliance officer; business development manager; and deputy general manager at various locations.

Among the highlights of his banking career were charting the course of a new First Bank of Nigeria (FBN); obtaining the license for the FBN UK Branch; setting up the FBN's Compliance Department; and uncovering fraudulent foreign currency mail practices in the bank. He was voted Best Group Head in FBN for 2007-2008.

Dr. Caiafas has represented the A.M.E. Zion Church six times as an overseas delegate at conferences held in the USA.

He is married with five children and eight grandchildren.

Rev. Joyce M. Smith

Presiding Elder, Oregon-Washington Cascade District, A.M.E. Zion Church

The Rev. Joyce M. Smith is a native of Mexia, Texas. She graduated from Dunbar High School in Mexia and attended Multnomah School of the Bible in Portland, Oregon. She was ordained in 1979 in the Oregon-Washington Conference of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, Western Episcopal District.

Rev. Smith faithfully served as an associate minister until 1989 when she was appointed as pastor of Pauline Memorial A.M.E. Zion Church in Salem, Oregon, under the leadership of Bishop George W. Walker Sr. She served this charge with excellence as a bivocational pastor for 20 years, commuting more than 136 miles roundtrip three to four times a week.

While shepherding Pauline Memorial A.M.E. Zion Church, membership increased from five to more than 100 members; the church's mortgage was burned (satisfied); and a modular unit was purchased to facilitate a partnership with the Marion County Food Bank to assist in meeting the needs of the rising hunger among the homeless population.

Rev. Smith retired from her secular employment with the state of Washington after 25 years of service, where she worked as an employment specialist assisting youth and dislocated workers.

Coming full circle, she returned to her hometown and has been serving as pastor of Community A.M.E. Zion Church for the past 13 years. Her record of accomplishments at Community A.M.E. Zion Church are also stellar. Under her leadership, church membership is at 148 members; the mortgage on the duplex rental property owned by the church is satisfied; and the Jennie T. Kemp Center was changed from non-profit to for-profit status in order to provide rental housing for low-income families.

During the height of the pandemic, the church partnered with the local NAACP branch to provide food boxes, COVID-19 testing kits and masks for 3,200 residents in the Vancouver community. In addition, the church added several distance members from Piedmont, South Carolina; Las Vegas, Nevada; and Seattle, Washington. The church's Facebook social media following also increased to 642.

In 2017, Rev. Smith was elevated to presiding elder of the Oregon-Washington Cascade District and reappointed to the position in 2021 under Bishop George Crenshaw. In this capacity, she oversees six churches. She has also brought in a new church plant, Humble Beginnings A.M.E. Zion Church, in Vancouver, Washington, and continues 25-plus years of service as conference treasurer for the Cascade District, Oregon-Washington Conference.

She is well known in the Washington and Oregon area as an anointed preacher and teacher, prayer warrior, motivational speaker and singer. She holds memberships in the NAACP of Vancouver; the Albina Ministerial Alliance; Women's Aglow; and The Balm in Gilead.

Rev. Smith has been married for 58 years to Jackie E. Smith Sr. She has three sons, four grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

Her motto is: "If I can help somebody as I pass along, if I can help somebody with a word or song, if I can show somebody they are traveling wrong, then my living shall not be in vain."

The Academic Costume

The custom of wearing academic dress stems from the Middle Ages when scholars were also clerics and wore the costume of their monastic order. The hood was originally a cowl attached to the gown, which could be slipped over the head for warmth. The cap was originally round but has changed to the varieties that we see today.

The gown varies for the respective degrees. The Bachelor's gown is worn closed and can be distinguished by its long, open sleeves. The Master's gown is designed to be open or closed with the arms worn through the slits in the elbows of the sleeves. The Doctor's gown is also worn open or closed and has full, bell-shaped sleeves with three horizontal bars stitched across the upper arm. There is a velvet panel draped around the neck and stitched down the front edges. This velvet trimming may be either black or the same color as the velvet border of the hood.

The hood also varies for the respective degrees. The Bachelor's and Master's hoods are of the same design, pointed at the base. The Bachelor's hood is three feet long; and the Master's hood is three-and-one-half feet long. The Doctor's hood is four feet long, of fuller shape and rounded at the base. The hood is bordered with velvet, the color of which indicates the field of study in which the degree was earned. Some of the colors listed below will be worn by graduates of the various disciplines at Livingstone College.

The silk lining of the hood represents the institution, which granted the degree. If more than one degree is held, the gown and the hood of the higher or highest degree is worn. The linings seen in today's academic procession may include:

The Academic Degree

The first known degree was a doctorate conferred by the University of Bologna in the middle of the 12th Century. Originally, the doctor's and master's degree were used interchangeably, each indicating that the holder was qualified to give instruction to students. The bachelor's or baccalaureate degree indicated only entrance upon a course of study preparatory to the doctorate or mastership. Gradually, however, the bachelor's degree came to mean successful completion of one level of study preparatory to the higher degrees.

The Bachelor's Degree*

The bachelor's degree represents completion of a four-year course of study of collegiate grade. The degree Bachelor of Arts was first conferred in America in 1642 on nine young men, comprising the first graduating class of Harvard College. Yale conferred its first Bachelor of Arts in 1702; Princeton in 1748; The College of William and Mary in 1753; Pennsylvania in 1757; Columbia in 1758 and *Livingstone College around 1887*.

The Master's Degree

The master's degree is an academic honor conferred upon students who have successfully completed one or two years' work beyond the baccalaureate. A thesis and an oral examination are usually required.

The Doctor's Degree**

The doctor's degree represents the most advanced degree conferred by American institutions of higher education. The Oxford English Dictionary defines a doctor in the academic sense as "one who, in any faculty or branch of learning, has attained the highest degree conferred by a university."

There are two major types of doctoral degrees; earned and honorary doctorates. Earned doctorates are further divided into two distinct types – the research degree and the professional or practitioner degree. The distinguishing feature of the research degree is that it normally requires a lengthy scholarly dissertation that is usually designed to constitute a substantial contribution to the existing body of knowledge in its field. The most important doctorate of the research type in American institutions of higher education is the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.). The only other earned doctorate of the research type, which has secured wide recognition and is used by a large number of leading American universities, is the Doctor of Education (Ed.D.). The honorary doctorate degree is awarded by colleges and universities in recognition of scholarly or creative attainments or distinguished public service. The most commonly awarded honorary doctorates are: Doctor of Laws (LL.D.), first conferred in 1773; Doctor of Letters (Litt. D.) first awarded in 1892; Doctor of Science (Sc./D.) first conferred in 1884; and Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.), first awarded in the 1880s.

*Sometimes designated as the baccalaureate degree, from the Latin *baccalaris* "under the influence of" and *laurus* "Laurel" used as a designation of honor, distinction or fame.

A Brief History Of The College

Livingstone College and Hood Theological Seminary were originally founded as Zion Wesley Institute by a group of AM.E. Zion ministers for the purpose of training ministers in the Cabarrus County town of Concord, North Carolina in 1879. After three brief sessions, directed by principals, Bishop C. R. Harris and Professor A. S. Richardson, the Institute ultimately closed in Concord.

In 1881, Dr. Joseph Charles Price and Bishop J.W. Hood changed roles as delegates to the Ecumenical Conference and became fundraisers with the mission to re-establish Zion Wesley Institute. The Rowan County town of Salisbury, just 20 miles northeast of Concord, gave the trustees a generous donation of \$1,000 and an invitation to relocate the school in Salisbury. They accepted both, and the College reopened in Salisbury in 1882 with Dr. Price as president.

The new site of the College was J. M. Gray's farm called Delta Grove. This site consisted of one building and 40 acres. In 1887, by an act of the legislature, the name Zion Wesley Institute was changed to Livingstone College in honor of David Livingstone, the great Christian missionary, philanthropist and explorer.

Since its inception, the College has had two principals and eighteen presidents, four of whom were interim and two of whom were acting. The current physical plant consists of 25 buildings, seven of which are listed in the National Register.

Mission Statement

Livingstone College is a private historically black college that is secured by a strong commitment to quality instruction, academic excellence and student success.
